Carolyn Logan Gluck, Chair of today's meeting, called the meeting to order at 9:04 am.

March 2020 minutes

The March 2020 minutes were moved and seconded for approval by Co-Chair Emeritus Barry Frankel and seconded by Member Anthony Liberatore and then approved by the Members present.

Chair Logan Gluck next provided the meeting with an update on the health of Chair Emeritus Rick del Mastro. Following discussion, Co-Chair Emeritus Frankel proposed the following resolution, which was seconded by Chair Emeritus D'Andrea and approved unanimously by the Members present:

The Wainscott Citizens Advisory Committee unanimously recognizes the unique and long-time contributions of Rick Del Mastro to the WCAC and the full Wainscott community. It wishes him a full and speedy recovery and return home.

Chair Logan Gluck noted that the above resolution will be entered into the meeting minutes and posted on the East Hampton Town web site.

Thereafter, Chair Logan Gluck asked Councilman Jeff Bragman to provide his liaison report.

Liaison Report: Councilman Jeff Bragman

Councilman Bragman reported on current Coronavirus patient numbers for Suffolk County, and then discussed how the Town Board is operating during this time. He also described the small reorganization of the local government, using a “unified command” approach.

He next provided an overview of certain social support services, including resilience networks and food pantries. Members raised questions and discussed related issues, including about the new signs at the beach, the availability of and requirements for masks and community support and involvement in this time.

Councilman Bragman concluded by noting that Orsted’s plans to take test borings have been deferred, and that with respect to the airport issues he is trying to set up a meeting with the FAA.

Other Business

Next Member Bruce Solomon proposed that the WCAC work with the Sewing Society to ring the Chapel bell on Friday nights to coincide with community thank you displays going on in the city. Discussion ensued, and it was the sense of the Members to pursue the proposal and also to display a sign at the Chapel to similarly recognize efforts and contributions.
