

The Community Preservation Fund Law was enacted to help protect and preserve open and undeveloped lands in the Town of East Hampton and the incorporated Villages, including wetlands, woodlands, agricultural lands, shorelands and the other natural resources of the town; for the purposes of protecting historic places and properties within the town; and for the purpose of providing the town's visitors and residents with outdoor recreational opportunities.

The East Hampton Town Code categorizes a Nature Preserve as any area of land or water owned by the Town which is formally dedicated to being maintained as nearly as possible in its natural condition. These lands are chosen for preservation based on the unique and valuable ecological assets situated within their boundaries. They are protected not only as a means to preserve the land in its natural state, but to create a multi-use recreational resource to be enjoyed by all.

(879) **ADOPT LOCAL LAW:**
COMMUNITY PRESERVATION PROJECT PLAN (REVISED)

The following resolution was offered by Councilwoman D. Weir, seconded by Councilwoman P. Mansir, and adopted:

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the Town Board of the Town of East Hampton on **June 19, 2003**, regarding a Local Law adopting a revised "Community Preservation Project Plan," pursuant to § 64-e of the New York Town Law, which provides for the preservation of open space, historic places, and recreational areas within the Town of East Hampton, including the incorporated villages therein, to include lands reputedly owned by Brigitte R. Jossem and identified on the Suffolk County Tax Map as SCTM #300-126-1-12.4 and 13, all as more fully set forth in the text of the Local Law; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has considered the comments of all persons regarding this Local Law, both as submitted in writing and as presented orally at the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has prepared and considered Environmental Assessment Forms which evaluate the potential environmental impacts of the proposed Local Law; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the adoption of this Local Law will not have a significant negative impact upon the environment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that a negative declaration is hereby made pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the said Local Law is hereby enacted to read as follows:

LOCAL LAW NO 17 OF 2003
INTRODUCTORY NO 17 OF 2003

A Local Law providing for the adoption of a revised "Community Preservation Project Plan," pursuant to § 64-e of the New York Town Law, which provides for the preservation of open space, historic places, and recreational areas within the Town of East Hampton, including the incorporated villages therein, to include lands reputedly owned by Brigitte R. Jossem and identified on the Suffolk County Tax Map as SCTM #300-126-1-12.4 and 13, as more fully set forth in the text of the Local Law, said Local Law to read as follows:

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of East Hampton as follows:

SECTION I. - FINDINGS AND OBJECTIVES:

This local law adopts a revised "Community Preservation Project Plan" pursuant to §64-e of the New York Town Law. The revised plan supplants the Community Preservation Project Plan which was first adopted by the Town Board on August 4, 1998 and adopted as revised on June 6, 2003 (West Lake Tennis Club and Piliero property added), and which continues to list all properties whose preservation is necessary to the preservation of the community character of the Town of East Hampton.

The only change to the plan as most recently adopted June 6, 2003 is the addition of 7.6 acres of land reputedly owned by Brigitte R. Jossem off Red Dirt Road at Stony Hill, Amagansett (SCTM #300-126-1-12.4 & 13).

SECTION II. – COMMUNITY PRESERVATION PROJECT PLAN ADOPTED:

For the reasons set forth in Section I hereof, the Town Board hereby approves and adopts the "Community Preservation Project Plan" prepared by the Town Planning Department and dated June 6, 2003, said plan being intended to constitute, in its revised form, the community preservation project plan which is required by §64-e of the New York Town Law and Article I ("Community Preservation Fund") of the East Hampton Town Code.

SECTION III. - SEVERABILITY:

Should any part or provision of this Local Law be decided by the courts to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Local Law as a whole nor any part thereof other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION IV. - EFFECTIVE DATE:

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State as provided by law.

(880) AUTHORIZE ACQUISITION Property of BRIGITTE R JOSSEM AND ATRIUM SQUARE, INC SCTM #300-126-1-12.4 & 13

The following resolution was offered by Supervisor J. Schneiderman, seconded by Councilwoman p. Mansir, and adopted:

WHEREAS, pursuant to § 247 of the General Municipal Law and § 64-e of the Town Law of the State of New York, the Town Board held a public hearing on **June 19, 2003** to consider the acquisition of approximately 7.6 acres of land located at Stony Hill, Amagansett, which land is identified on the Suffolk County Tax Map as SCTM #300-126-1-12.4 & 13; and

WHEREAS, the proposed purchase price for fee simple acquisition of the subject property is \$ 800,000.00, plus survey, title, prorated tax, and recording charges; and

WHEREAS, said property consists of high-quality American beech and oak woodlands and adjoins the Paumanok Path, and also contains a large glacial kettlehole known as the Baker Kettlehole; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of said acquisition is preservation of open space; and

WHEREAS, the acquisition of the subject property is classified as a Type II Action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA); and

WHEREAS, the Town Board finds, pursuant to § 64-e (8) of the New York Town Law, that acquisition of the subject property by purchase is the best alternative, of all reasonable alternatives available to the Town, for protection of the community character of the Town of East Hampton, and that such acquisition would be in the best interests of the Town;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Supervisor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract of sale with the record owner of the subject property, reputedly **Brigitte R. Jossem and Atrium Square, Inc.**, for the purpose of acquiring said property at a cost to the Town of East Hampton not to exceed \$ **800,000.00**, plus reasonable survey, title, prorated tax, and recording charges; and be it further

RESOLVED, that pursuant to contract the Supervisor is authorized and directed to execute any documents and the Town Budget Officer is directed to pay the purchase price and any and all

reasonable survey, title, prorated tax, and recording charges, as may be necessary to effect the transfer of title; and be it further

RESOLVED, the monies to be expended for purchase of the foregoing property shall be drawn from the Town of East Hampton Community Preservation Fund Budget Account; and be it further

**(1016) ADOPT LOCAL LAW:
ADD PROPERTIES TO TOWN NATURE PRESERVE**

The following resolution was offered by Councilperson Councilman J. Potter seconded by Councilwoman P. Mansir and adopted:

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the Town Board of the Town of East Hampton on **July 15, 2004** regarding a Local Law amending Chapter 182 ("East Hampton Town Nature Preserve") of the East Hampton Town Code in order to add additional lands to the register of properties dedicated to the Town Nature Preserve, all as more fully set forth in the text of the Local Law; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has considered the comments of all persons regarding this Local Law, either as submitted in writing or as presented orally at the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, both the Town Nature Preserve Committee and the Town Planning Department have reviewed the properties proposed to be dedicated to the Town Nature Preserve, and both agencies recommend that the properties described in this Local Law be so dedicated; and

WHEREAS, the proposed dedication of the properties to the Nature Preserve is either not an action subject to review pursuant to SEQRA or, alternatively, is a Type II action pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617.5 (c) (20) and requires no further SEQRA review; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the said Local Law is hereby enacted to read as follows:

**LOCAL LAW NO19 OF 2003
INTRODUCTORY NO 27 OF 2003**

A Local Law providing for the amendment of Chapter 182 ("East Hampton Town Nature Preserve") of the East Hampton Town Code in order to add additional properties to the register of lands dedicated to the Town Nature Preserve, as more fully set forth in the text of the Local Law, said Local Law to read as follows:

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of East Hampton as follows:

SECTION I. - FINDINGS AND OBJECTIVES:

This local law amends Chapter 182 of the Town Code to add additional properties to the Town Nature Preserve. The Register of Properties dedicated to the Nature Preserve will be amended to appear as shown in Section II below. The parcels proposed for dedication to the Nature Preserve consist of a diverse group of ecologically significant parcels containing wetlands, woodlands and waterfront parcels acquired by the Town for the purpose of open space preservation.

SECTION II. - TOWN CODE AMENDED:

Chapter 182 ("East Hampton Town Nature Preserve") of the East Hampton Town Code is hereby amended at Article IV, with respect to Table I, II, III, IV and V of the Register of Properties, said amended tables to include the following parcels by School District:
