RECYCLABLE ITEMS

1. **CLOTHING**: Place usable clothing in charity containers
2. **BATTERIES (All types)**: Place small household batteries in appropriate containers
3. **MIXED PAPER**: Typically any Paper used for reading or writing (Catalogs, telephone books, junk mail, shiny newsprint, etc.)
4. **ELECTRONICS**: Computers, televisions, cellphones, video cameras, VCR & DVD players
5. **NEWSPAPER (No glossy print)**: Glossy print goes in mixed paper
6. **TIN CANS/ALUMINUM**: Pet food cans, soda & beer cans, soup cans, empty aerosol & latex paint cans, etc.
7. **GLASS BOTTLES & JARS (Only)**: No ceramic, light bulbs, plate glass, or stemware
Glass is crushed onsite and is available to residents free of charge.
8. **CORRUGATED CARDBOARD**: All types, including shiny and/or painted lettering. Please empty all Styrofoam and paper packaging, and flatten cardboard.
9. **PLASTIC BOTTLES (#1 & #2 only– Caps Removed)**: These bottles are identified as #1 or #2 inside the recycling logo on the bottom of the bottle. No toys, flower pots, bags, etc. The neck of the bottle must be smaller than the body. If the container has a food product in it, it will go in non-recycled waste, even if it is a #1 or #2 plastic.

Please note that Styrofoam CANNOT be recycled, including cups, food containers, coolers, and packaging peanut foam. These items should be discarded with the regular trash.

Please observe signs on each recycle container for proper sorting
